THE EUKARYOTIC GENOME

is to be held in Brno, Czech Republic, October 14th (noon) -16th (2 p.m.) 2010.



The workshop is meant to bring together scientists working in different model systems and on different aspects of genome structure and functional organisation. It is geared to all modern developments, including technical ones, with special emphasis on basic research.

The workshop will be held in the Augustinian Abbey in Brno, where Johann Gregor Mendel worked out his laws, in the uninhibited atmosphere of intellectual exchange.
