## Full costing: best practice in Europe

There is an increasing awareness of the importance of full costing throughout Europe. Most European universities have realized that full costing is an important step towards long-term financial sustainability. Strategic management decisions and growing demand for identifying the real costs of externally funded activities, combined with the requirements of some external fund providers, have driven universities to pay more attention to this issue.

In Europe, there are already several universities running full costing systems. However, many universities are still in the process of developing their full costing models. Development of such systems is a highly demanding process in terms of methodology, finances, personnel, time and the experience required. Therefore, exchange of knowledge and best practices between European institutions is of paramount importance.

The aim of this conference is to present existing full costing models from different European institutions (mainly universities) and thus help other institutions in the development of their own full costing methodologies. Speakers from the Netherlands, Great Britain, Spain, Germany, Austria and Portugal will share their experiences in the development, implementation and running of full costing systems. There will be a particular emphasis on the technical aspects (specific calculation and booking schemes, choice of cost drivers etc.). Also, some of the speakers will share their experiences during the certification of their methodologies for indirect costs by the European Commission, for the purpose of the Seventh Framework Programme for Research and Development. In addition the European Commission will present its view on the full costing issue.

The target audience of the conference is primarily representatives of European universities that are in the process of developing their full costing systems. Representatives from other institutions, mainly public research institutions, are also welcome.
