

BUILDING OF BRIDGES


The international conference European Forum for Science and Technology is held by Česká hlava (Czech Mind) in cooperation with The University of Economics in Prague. Last year with the topic "Efficiency of the European Science and it's Competitiveness in the World" presented among the main speakers the head of the software giant Microsoft Steve Balmer, the scientific director of the international research project ITER Michel Chatelier, John Ellis from the research centre of particle physics CERN or Diarmiud JD MacDougall from the international advisory company PricewaterhouseCoopers.

The reputation of the European Science and Technology Forum is reflected by participation of the Nobel Prize laureates prof. Sir Harold W. Kroto (Great Britain), prof. Claude Cohen-Tannoudji (France), prof. Richard R. Ernst (Switzerland), prof. Timothy Hunt (Great Britain) and others.

We also invite representatives from the world of politics; among the Czech politicians Mirek Topolánek (The Prime Minister of the Czech Republic) or Vladimír Špidla (EU commissioner) and several more representatives of the foreign ministry resorts administering universities and science.
