





1 Early Medieval ecclesiastic Architecture at Stará Boleslav Stronghold as an Archaeological Research Subject





3 Presence of other potential Early Medieval ecclesiastic buildings on the core of Přemyslid stronghold, and in its bailey







... and changes of the settlement area the Early Middle Ages


- the chapter area was divided by stone walls into several areal units





