

## Integral and Integralism: towards the total avant-garde

The avant-garde magazine Integral was founded in Bucharest in March 1925, had 15 issues, and ceased to appear in April 1928. Integral aimed to be an epitome of progress in every cultural field, and at an international level, as pointed out by its full title: "Integral. Organ of the Local and International Modern Movement". By assimilating (abusively) Cubism and Constructivism to a scientific style, Integralism turned art into technocracy, in order to better fit the (pre-supposed) expectations and requirements of the (early) corporate society, fascinated by mechanical production, luxury, hygiene, sport, comfort, and entertainment. Integralism was a manifestation of the widespread move to attune each element of the daily, artistic, and spiritual life to that totalizing modern "rhythm" evoked by Integral's contributors.
