Close all open dialogs by pressing OK. In this moment by the bottom bar should appear prompted for a login. At this time, the lower bar appears prompted for a login. If they fail to open a wireless connection and connect to the network eduroam.

After successful login to the network eduroam WinXP saved username and password. This happens automatically and can not be avoid this.

To remove the login information you need to edit the system registry:

- Click on **Start** button and select **Run** ...
- In the **Open** field: type **regedit** and click on the button **OK**
- Locate the key HKEY_CURRENT_USER\Software\Microsoft\EAPOL\UserEapInfo and click on it
- In the **Edit** menu, click on the **Delete**
- Click on **Yes** to confirm delete key
- Quit Registry Editor.
