Since bullying clearly transgresses moral principles and defending clearly regards them, morality variables, such as moral emotions or moral disengagement, have been investigated in association with these behaviors. The research has markedly contributed to understanding bullying-related behaviors. The first presentation addresses an interplay between witnessing of bullying and collective moral disengagement in prediction of fear of victimization. The second study introduces interactive effects of guilt and moral disengagement in understanding three behaviors in bullying incidents: bullying, defending, and outsider behavior. Practical implications of the two studies will be discussed.
