Protests and Parades National days in Czechoslovakia and Hungary, 1918–1989

Andrea Talabér Masarykův ústav a Archiv AV ČR

The lecture will present a comparative history of national day commemorations in Czechoslovakia and Hungary from 1918 to 1989. The book project, stemming from her doctoral thesis, offers a comprehensive history of national days in both Hungary and Czechoslovakia by employing a sequential diachronic approach that examines national days in each type of regime throughout this period. Of particular interest here are the ways in which each successive regime sought to overhaul the national day calendars of its predecessor, which it claimed to have overthrown. The book focuses on how these contrasting regimes grappled with, initially rejected and eventually incorporated aspects of the preceding regime's national days. During her talk, she will focus in particular on the central methodology of the book, which is its comparative history approach and how this comparison of Hungary and Czechoslovakia has enabled her to ask more probing questions and have a deeper understanding of each country.
