# Housing and care solutions for elderly

Part I.

### Literature review

- Limited national research projects
- Descriptive academic and grey literatures
- Few micro data on health, socio-economic status, social relationships, family networks
- No data on informal care
- Difficulties in international comparison HU is not part of International SHARE survey (some results from GGP).



### Social status of elderly people's interpretation

- Problem-focused view
  - Common themes:
    - Demographic changes
    - Housing circumstances
    - Problems of the social system
    - Problems of the health system
    - Problems of the pension system

#### Resource-focused view

- Neglected areas in professional discussion:
  - Quality of life
  - Active ageing
  - Mobility plans of elderly
  - Intergeneration cooperation
  - Community-based services

Policy attention is predominantly focused on the financial-economic consequences of ageing.

### In the mirror of statistics

- In the last 30 years the ratio of elderly people increased from 17,2% to 21,4%.
- In 40% of households live elderly people (1,6 M households)
- Territorial differences: more elderly live in the villages
- 3,31 million people get pension or other pention-based supplies. (29% of the total population, 11,2% of GDP)
- Estimation of the ratio of 65+: 29,4% in 2050

## Services and supports for elderly to live in their homes independently

- Financial support
- Contribution-in-kind
- Home care service
- Institution providing daycare
- Village and farm caretaker service
- Support service
- Professional health care at home (not under the SWA)

# Housing policy and housing system

Part II.

### Housing policy

- Privatization: 336.000 municipalityowned rental apartments were sold (1986-)
- 2,7% of the ratio of municipality-owned rental apartments (EU: 20-60%)
- No active housing policy
- No extended social rented flat system

# Impact of crisis on national housing policy

- Foreign currency mortgages, increased number of borrowers constitute of the greatest economic, financial and social challenges facing Hungary.
- In 2011 the outstanding debt was HUF 6,3 billion, with 70% in foreign currency.
- Government pays special attention, the measures taken are rather short term solutions.

### Best practices

### 1. Community building: Neighborhood voluntary program

- Volunteers welcome neighbors in their own homes (neighborhood day)
- Targets: give information, collect community needs, host lonely and elderly people.
- Location: Debrecen garden city area
- Mission: community needs common problem solving

#### 2. Housing accessibility: Elderly-friendly housing model

- Aim: show that elderly people can continue living at home safely and independently.
- 50 flats were involved into the project (Budapest, Debrecen, Tiszavasvári) and were made obstacle-free.
- Main result: no more falls or their number was reduced.

# 73. Housing affordability: Missing area!

- Housing affordability is a missing area of housing and elderly care policy and practice in HU
- No real good practice or model program.
- Special field: get some idea from your BPs.

### 4. Social and health care: Emergency alarm system

- Aim: Ensure the safety of older people living at home by elaborating an ICT-based solution to provide immediate help in case of a fall.
- Since 1993 (HMCS), Budapest
- Home care combined with an alarm system
- In 2000 the home alarm service was incorporated into the Social Welfare Act. (In 2011 the system has 20.000 recipients)

### 5. Access to information: Skype care

- Learn to use Skype / start a new life in an intergeneration project.
- Target group: 15 lonely, depressed older people, receiving home care, average age 80+ years, with limited mobility
- Main result: Elderly people depression turned into a positive attitude, their loneliness disappeared.
