

Dear IAMP members,

the proposed changes in the Statutes and Bylaws announced in the April issue of the Newsletter were discussed at the General Assembly in Rio. To be accepted they need an approval by a postal ballot.

Let me recall that the aim of the proposed changes is to adjust to the electronic age ways making our decision making more efficient.
