Anotace:

The literary Macedonian language was codified and implemented in 1945 as the official language of the Socialist Republic of Macedonia. The first scholarly grammar of literary Macedonian ever to be published is the "Grammar of the Macedonian Literary Language" written by Horace Lunt (1952, Skopje). However, the distinguished Soviet specialist in South Slavic Samuil Borisovič Bernštejn also authored a literary Macedonian grammar. It could have been the first scholarly grammar of literary Macedonian, but the grammar remained unpublished in the then-current political climate due to the so-called Tito-Stalin Split, which had taken place in 1948. My paper is based on Bernštejn's unpublished manuscript, which I recently discovered in Moscow. I will describe the history and fate of this manuscript and critically discuss Bernštejn's views on the Macedonian literary language and the version of literary Macedonian that he proposed and promoted.
