STATEMENT


The V4 Forum Academies express their wish to contribute to the improvement of the common European Research Area as the basic environment in which our scientists perform their research activities. We carefully follow the discussions going on the Horizon 2020 programme for research and innovation prepared by the European Commission. In this regard


- we support the proposal to increase significantly the Horizon 2020 budget as compared to the allocation for research in the previous 7th Framework Programme;
- we find important to implement the program in the way maintaining significant presence of collaborative projects with small number of participants and relatively small budgets;
- we consider the harmonization of Horizon2020 and the rules for the use of European Structural Funds in the next programming period as crucial in covering the existing under-representation of our researchers in European collaborative programmes.


V4 Forum Academies welcome the foundation of *Science Europe* and its Vision and Mission statements on cooperation between policy and activity levels in science. We also welcome the ambition to form the third voice of the scientific community, besides European Commission and national governments. V4 Forum Academies feel their obligation to contribute to this very important issue.
