Search of Papers using E-journals Portal

This short guide demonstrates how to quickly find and access journals using Charles University *E-journals portal*. For instance, one needs to find a paper entitled “Grandmothers and Granddaughters: Old-Age Pensions and Intrahousehold Allocation in South Africa” by E. Duflo published in *World Bank Economic Review* in year 2003. Using *E-journals portal* one can quickly find out if papers in the *World Bank Economic Review* are accessible and get links to full-text papers if they are accessible.

2. Entering the journal name in the search line yields the results shown below. There is a list of available sources from which the journal could be accessed. Clicking on one of the sources in the list eventually takes to the journal archive.
