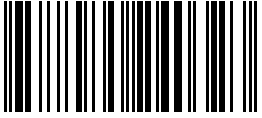

The Mikulčice site and the results of its long-term research represent a phenomenon that is essential for understanding the lifestyle and identity of the highest social classes of Mojmirid Moravia. No other 9th-century archaeological site in the north of the Middle Danube provides such concentrated evidence of power, wealth and Christian faith as Mikulčice.
