Czech Republic Visa Policy

The Czech Republic has been a member of the European Union since 2004. Citizens of the EU member states are required to carry their passports or other form of valid identification in order to enter the country. The same applies for the citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland, who can move freely around the EU states. In 2007, the Czech Republic signed the Schengen agreement. The list of countries whose citizens require a visa in order to visit can be found here-new-member of the European Union since 2004. BRIC 8 COVID-19 Safety Policy

Effective April 9, 2022, the Czech Republic has suspended all COVID-19 related entry restrictions for travelers. Travelers to the Czech Republic are no longer required to complete a Passenger Locator Form, provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination or prior infection, etc.

CERGE-EI continues to prioritize the safety of its visitors and staff. We monitor local and international guidelines and regulations relating to COVID-19.

Please note that CERGE-El's testing requirements for access to events change with the pandemic situation and may go further than the local government's COVID-19 regulations.

COVID-19 self-testing for BRIC 8 participants as an extra layer of safety

The international organizing committee of BRIC 8 requests that all BRIC 8 participants undergo self-testing upon arrival. A VivaDiag Pro SARS-CoC-2 Ag Rapid Test kit will be provided to you at the conference registration desk. You will then be asked to proceed to the Testing Room (Room # 1) to carry out a self-test. Please follow the test procedure instructions displayed in the Testing Room.

If you test positive for COVID-19, please act responsibly; inform the conference staff at the registration desk and follow the advice provided. People who test positive for COVID-19 while in the Czech Republic should dial 1221 to reach the COVID-19 Information hotline. The hotline is open daily from 8 am to 7 pm and is available in English. Safe conduct at the event

By attending, you agree to abide by CERGE-EI's health & safety rules, which includes:

- not coming to the event, or leaving promptly if you test positive for COVID-19 upon arrival, or develop symptoms associated with COVID-19, or if you are required to be in self-isolation or quarantine by COVID-19 regulations in the Czech Republic or at the location you are travelling from;
- observing good hand-washing and hygiene etiquette; hand sanitizing opportunities are provided throughout the building.

No mask-wearing policy is currently enforced for either staff or conference participants. Voluntary wearing of face masks is recommended (please bring your own supply of face masks).

Fares (short-term tickets for adults):

♦ 30 minutes	30 CZK	Not valid on the Funicular to Petřín
♦ 90 minutes	40 CZK	Not valid on the Funicular to Petřín

♦ 72 hours	330 CZK	It is valid on the Funicular to Petřín

Public transport tickets can be purchased:

Prague Taxi Service

We recommend to use official taxi services only. Approximate price of Prague taxi services:

- Boarding fee (minimum charge) CZK 40 (€1.50)
- 1 km CZK 28 (€ 1.05)
- 1-minute wait CZK 6 (€ 0.25)

Transport from/to Airport

The International Václav Havel Airport Prague is situated in the northwest of Prague. Personal transit to the airport is provided by buses of the Prague Transport Authority and by the special AE (Airport Express) bus.
