and gave great pleasure.

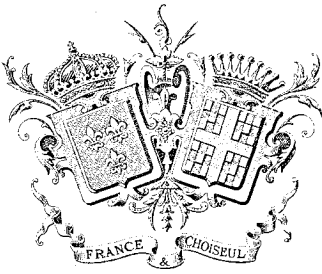
Now in answer to
